The Storehouse Community Center Grows Job Training Opportunities With North Texas Food Bank Grant

PLANO, TEXAS - December 23, 2024 - The Storehouse Community Center (TSCC) is proud to announce the launch of its Work Well Certificate, a transformative job training initiative made possible by a \$61,498 grant from the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB). Awarded earlier this fiscal year through NTFB's Hope for Tomorrow grant program, this funding has been instrumental in expanding TSCC's Academy and job partnership programs.

"Our relationship with the North Texas Food Bank provides millions of pounds of food to neighbors in the community each year," said Candace Winslow, CEO of The Storehouse Community Center. "Many of our neighbors come to The Storehouse for the first time to receive food, made possible by the NTFB's longstanding partnership since 2009. This is their starting line – their entry point to our

programs - leading them to The Academy and to Work Well. As we share information about our additional programs and discover their needs, our vision is to create relationships that ultimately lead to living-wage employment and transformation."

The Academy, TSCC's signature adult educational and job training initiative, has seen record enrollment each semester. With NTFB's support this year, TSCC has expanded its team by welcoming Maripily Gonzalez, who has already made significant strides in growing the reach and impact of job partnerships and training through the Work Well course.

In October 2024, TSCC held a four-week Work Well Certificate pilot with 15 neighbors participating. The pilot culminated in participants undergoing mock job interviews with professional volunteers from Lennox's HOLA Hispanic/Latin Employee Resource Group and Lux Ice. Reflecting on her experience, participant Ruth Rodriguez said, "Through my Work Well training, I gained the tools and confidence I needed to advance my career and changed my outlook on what's possible for me and my family. I am grateful for the Work Well team and volunteers for being a part of my transformative journey toward greater career opportunities."

The primary objective of Work Well is to connect neighbors with trusted companies offering stable, living-wage employment opportunities. By providing mentorship and skills training, TSCC helps participants lay the foundation for long-term success and economic stability. TSCC plans to host six Work Well Certificate cohorts in 2025, starting in January.

Thanks to NTFB's generous support, TSCC's vision extends beyond providing basic needs. The organization aims to foster a supportive environment that empowers neighbors to transform their lives and the lives of their families, offering hope and opportunity for a brighter future.
